### National Professional Qualifications (NPQs)

East Manchester Teaching School Hub is partnered with University College London (UCL) to deliver the full suite of National Professional Qualifications. Scholarship funding for Autumn 2024 has changed.

If you are intending to use the NPQs next term as part of your staff development strategy, we would strongly advise you to check the PP <u>funding eligibility</u> list for your school and, if you are eligible for scholarships, submit applications to us, choosing **UCL** as the provider, as soon as possible

Fully completed applications (which must include the Headteacher approval) will be time stamped and allocated by UCL on this basis.

The new **NPQSENCO** has a larger allocation of scholarships available and is open to current SENCOs, those who need to complete the mandatory qualification, and those who are aspirant SENCOs or school leaders with elements of responsibility for inclusion. ## The MTPT Project

Support for Maternity, Paternity and Adoption Returners to Continue!

Colleagues working in state schools in the North West will continue to benefit from MTPT Project workshops and coaching whilst on maternity leave and as they return to work, thanks to ongoing support from regional Teaching School Hubs.

Throughout next academic year, teachers, leaders and support staff returning from parental leave can attend a 90 minute virtual Return to Work workshop ahead of their return – fully funded! Colleagues taking a period of maternity, adoption or shared parental leave can also enjoy fully-funded virtual group coaching, with five cohorts running next year. This year, more than 200 parent-teacher colleagues across England have benefitted from these programmes, supporting them to balance work and family life.
